

## **FACULTY FELLOWS PROGRAM APPALACHIAN STATE UNIVERSITY**

Appalachian State University invites applications for a tenure-track, nine-month faculty position, beginning August 2010, as part of the Faculty Fellows program. Applications will be considered from every discipline, but priority consideration will be given to applicants with appropriate credentials in Accounting; Finance, Banking & Insurance; Health, Leisure Studies & Exercise Science; History; Philosophy & Religion; Physics & Astronomy; Sustainable Development, Environmental Science, or a related environmental field; and Technology (programs include Appropriate Technology; Building Science; Graphic Arts & Imaging Technology; Industrial Design; Interior Design; Technical Photography; and Technology Education). Salary and rank will be commensurate with qualifications and experience.

Qualifications include an appropriate terminal degree; a record of or evidence of potential for success in teaching, scholarship and service; and a strong commitment to advancing diversity and inclusion within the Appalachian community. Applications are especially encouraged from candidates with life experiences unique to underrepresented student and faculty populations at Appalachian State University.

Faculty Fellows are expected to assume leadership roles in the university by serving as mentors/role models to students and by developing and participating in programs and initiatives designed to foster greater consciousness of diversity within the university community. Examples of such expectations may include: engaging in activities that lead to the advancement of the university's goal of preparing students to thrive in a diverse and global society; contributing to endeavors that improve access to higher education for students from disadvantaged and/or diverse backgrounds; and serving with other fellows on the Faculty Fellows Advisory Committee with the vice provost for faculty affairs. Such activities will be considered valuable to the university and will be recognized and honored within the department where the fellow holds his or her appointment.

Review of complete applications will begin on November 13, 2009, and continue until the position is filled.
